### Coffee Morning & Clothes Swap

Every one of us knows or knows of someone who has suffered from breast cancer. It is sobering to learn that in Gaza, five-year survival rates for women, and men, who get breast cancer are less than half of those in the UK. The reasons for this are several, including education, the fear of stigma and the restriction of goods into Gaza resulting in limited supplies of chemotherapy drugs and no radiotherapy being available. Travel to East Jerusalem hospitals for care involves applying for a permit to travel which means delay of treatment even if it is responded to or granted which in 28% of cases it is not. Women in Gaza undergo full mastectomies which in this country would not be necessary. £60 can provide education and screening by the Al Alhi Arab hospital community programme for one woman or man with potential symptoms. Emma and Dorothy warmly welcome you to a **coffee morning and clothes swap** to raise funds for **Amos Trust** who support the Al Alhi hospital. Unlimited tea, coffee, cake, good company all for a minimum donation of £10 and 1 or 2 pieces of good quality clothing which you no longer wear.
